
Life Events


No exterior work should be completed without proper architectural approval

The Board did have to approve a change order to fix some issues with the pools and spa that were not properly addressed during the last plastering project. The soil also needed to be lime treated to prevent too much shifting when they lay the concrete deck. Gunite has been installed and all pool plumbing has been installed and backfilled. The anticipated completion date as of now is the end of May.
