Architectural Approval

Per section 8 of the CC&Rs, please keep in mind:

no exterior addition or change or alteration may be made, until the plans and specifications showing the nature, kind, shape, color, height, size, materials, and location of the same have been submitted to the Architectural Committee and approved in writing by the Board.

We kindly remind you to submit an ARC application to obtain preapproval <u>prior to beginning any exterior projects.</u>

Life Events

We encourage you to share your significant life events with the Leisure Town community. Whether it's a wedding, a birth, a memorial service, or any other important occasion, we welcome you to email your brief announcement to Cindy@ltha.org. Your request must be by the 16th of the month to be included in the next month's newsletter. If you submit an announcement on behalf of someone else, please obtain their written approval beforehand.

Signs

All signs must be neat, clean, and in good condition. Political signs may be displayed 30 days before an election and must be removed within 10 days of the election. Signs may not exceed 9 square feet in size. Commercial signs for contractors at a residence may be displayed while work is being done, but not longer than 45 days. Signs advertising a Leisure Town business or homeowner-based business are prohibited.

Please remember to apply for pre-approval before beginning any renovation projects. The architectural (ARC) application may be picked up from the office or printed from www.ltha.org.




